Historical Note WW1

FRITHELSTOCK

Private George Lake, aged 21 years, has been killed in action on September 5th. Deceased was the third son of Mr Richard Lake of Eastbeer Farm, Merton, and joined up about 15 months ago. He was well known at Frithelstock. His father rented Drummetts Mills for a good many years before going to Merton. Pte Lake had only been in France just over two months. He was in the signal section, Royal Garrison Artillery. Mr Lake, who lost his wife some years ago, has another son in France, Mr John Lake, who is well known in Frithelstock, his wife being the youngest daughter of Mrs May, of the Clinton Arms, Frithelstock.

News has reached the parish that Pte. Charles Mitchell, aged 23 years, of the Pioneers (Canadians), died of wounds in France on July 26th. He was the third son of Mr and Mrs Samuel Mitchell, who for many years lived in the parish, and was the grandson of Mr William Langbridge, of Old Pound, Frithelstock.


