

Mr Charles Short, of Stone Cottage, Frithelstock, has heard officially that his son, Pte Ernest Short, who has been missing for some months past, was killed on 18 May 1917. The young man was only 19 years of age, and joined up in September 1916.


Beside the speakers the WI has restarted a Walking Group so anyone who wishes to get out and about in the area will be able to join with a readymade group of friends.
