Mr and Mrs Wickett, of Cloister Hall, Frithelstock, have received a letter from their son, Sergt. Wickett, of the Royal North Devon Hussars. He is suffering from enteric fever, and is in an Alexandria Hospital.

A New Author in our Parish

'Jennifer, a young widow, cooks dinner in the kitchen of her Devon cottage, unaware of the breaking news. A few miles away a 14-year-old schoolgirl has fallen into a swollen, icy river on Dartmoor during a training walk for the Ten Tors Challenge.

The girl is airlifted to hospital in a critical condition, but she doesn't regain consciousness. Her name is Charlotte Shaw. She is Jennifer's only child.

Now the hell begins. And in this moving, vividly written memoir Jennifer tells you exactly what it's like. She leaves nothing out!

The book has only been out for a few weeks and already Jennifer has been featured in the North Devon Journal and the Gazette – both publishing almost full page reviews. Tricky Bends in the Parish

Six years ago, this coming December (I think), during our miserable winter there were several 'accidents' on the blind corner in Frithelstock Stone – at the junction of Hele Lane when there was ice and snow on the roads. That initiated the Speedwatch checks that have taken place ever since. But that corner is not the only tricky one in our parish.

On Friday 14th July, a Mitsubishi Overlander entered Frithelstock travelling towards Frithelstock Stone. The right-hand bend approaching Pencleave Farm is deceptive. Unfortunately the driver misjudged the corner, hit the nearside wall and ricocheted across the road and into the stone wall – see images. This was not a speeding issue. It pays to simply remain focussed when driving. It could have been much worse. No one was driving towards the Mitsubishi at the time and no one was injured - though the driver's pride may have been hurt! Both car and wall suffered major damage.
